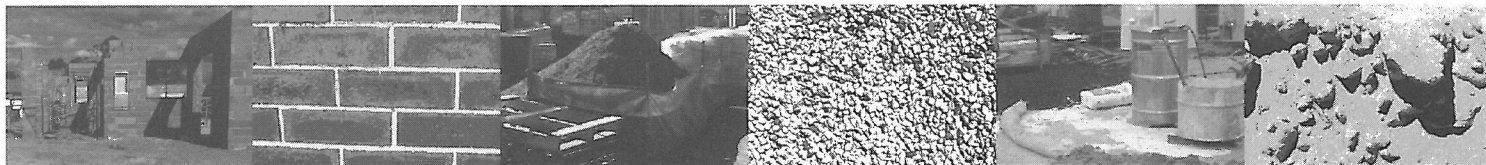


Builders and Supervisors



Building A Better Environment

If you are involved in the building industry, you are required to provide the right circumstances necessary to reduce any environmental impact as a result of the building process.

All building work must be carried out in a way to stop the entry of any pollution into the stormwater system.

The following hints are aimed at building activities and trades involved on a typical building site.

Builders

As a responsible builder you set the conditions that will reduce the environmental impact of the building process. Ensure that waste management and stormwater protection are a priority and that all supervisors are aware of the issues.

Use a waste management contractor that will recycle your waste timber, cardboard, paper, concrete, bricks, tiles and mortar.

Support contractors that use resources efficiently.

Site Supervisors

As a responsible supervisor on site you control the conditions that reduce the environmental impact of the building or construction process. Ensure that waste management and stormwater protection are a priority and that all trades people on site are aware of their responsibilities.

Keep the verge, footpath and gutter free of building materials and wastes.

Make provisions to avoid sand or other materials blowing onto the road.

Where possible designate a location for materials to be delivered to on site

Where possible designate a wash area on site to contain waste water.

Ensure all litter is stored on site to prevent any materials from entering the stormwater system or neighbouring land through either wind or water action.

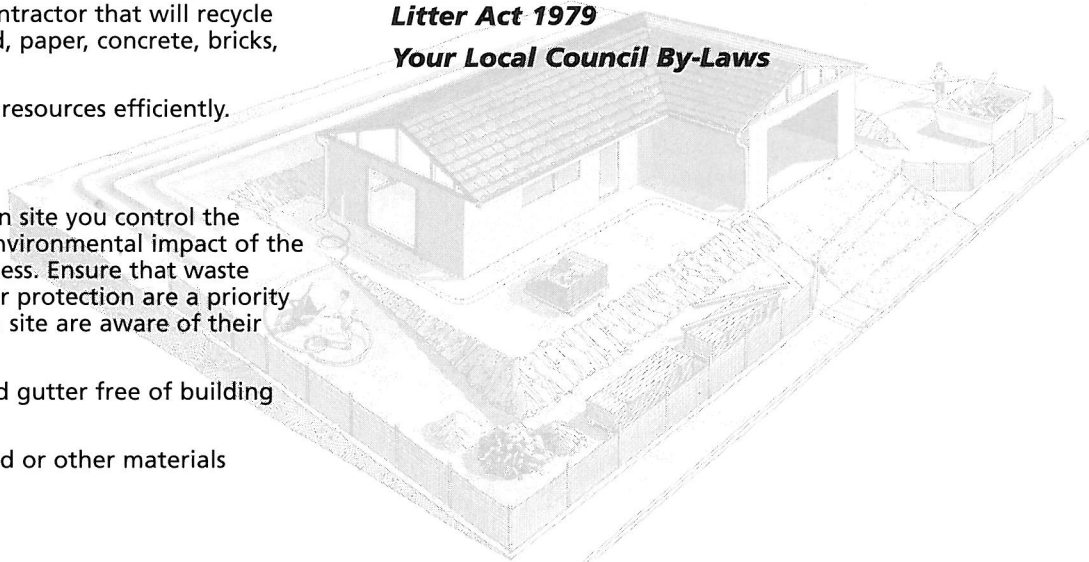
Provide a bin for food packaging and other domestic waste.
